Trinity St Stephen First School PE Statement

The government has spent over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016. This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

The money has been sent directly to schools and the allocation for Trinity St Stephen First School for 2016/2017 was £8,567.

Schools are required to publish information regarding the use of this money.

Trinity St Stephen First School will be using the grant for the following purposes:

1. To increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
2. To encourage and support the children in leading healthy active lifestyles
3. To increase the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school
4. Develop a greater opportunity for sports leadership roles
5. To increase the participation in competitive sport
