Trinity St Stephen First School PE Statement

The government has spent over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the last 4 academic years.

This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

The money has been sent directly to schools and the allocation for Trinity St Stephen First School for the financial year April 2018 to March 31st 2019 is £17,170.

Schools are required to publish information regarding the use of this money.

Trinity St Stephen First School will be using the grant for the following purposes:

1. To increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
2. All pupils are involved in regular physical activity
3. To increase the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school
4. To increase the participation in competitive sport
5. To involve children in a greater variety and broader range of sports

Impact of PE funding 2016 2017:

- Staff have developed their subject knowledge through training opportunities and access to good quality planning materials
- Sports Leaders involved in designing the school Sports Day
- Year groups 1 to 4 have taken part in borough wide competition
- Sports Leaders received training in leading sporting activities and able to lead playtime activities
- Participation in extracurricular active clubs (gymnastics and dance) has improved
